

# Garrity Procedures

Garrity v. New Jersey, 385 U.S. 493, 87 Sup. Ct. 616, 1967

You have been called as a respondent in a student disciplinary proceeding at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign by the Office for Student Conflict Resolution. You have indicated that (a) criminal charges have been filed against you, (b) you believe criminal charges may be filed against you, or (c) truthful answers to questions asked of you could possibly incriminate you under state or federal law. You have the right not to answer questions about this incident on the grounds that your answers might incriminate you.

You have indicated that you are not inclined to answer questions about this incident. Please understand that your status as a student at this state university is in jeopardy and a hearing body may draw appropriate inferences, including negative inferences, which could possibly lead to your dismissal, from your failure to respond to questions.

I am ordering you to answer questions. Will you do so?

\_\_\_\_ In an effort to protect my status as a student, I will answer.
